Dear Mr. Bodtcher:

This letter is to acknowledge receipt of your March 4, 2014, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, made to the National Park Service (NPS), for certain documents related to a specific "...large boulder..." and Capitol Reef National Park in Utah. Capitol Reef National Park is located within the Intermountain Region (IMR) of the NPS. Consequently, your request has been forwarded to the IMR office, here in Denver, for review and final response. Your request has been assigned tracking #NPS-2014-00348.

It is the policy of the National Park Service (NPS) to: (1) make records of the NPS available to the public to the greatest extent possible in keeping within the spirit of the FOIA; (2) make documents requested under the FOIA available at the earliest possible date while, at the same time, protecting the rights of the individuals involved and the administrative processes surrounding such rights; and (3) withhold documents falling within one of the FOIA exemptions only if disclosure is prohibited by either statute, regulation an/or Executive Order (EO).

Again, your request is being processed under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552); United States Department of the Interior ("Department") implementing regulations found at 43 C.F.R., Part 2, Subparts A through E, beginning at 2.1; and the Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. 552a (2006)). Please be advised that additional FOIA and/or Privacy Act guidance /regulations may also be found at either the Department's web site, [www.doi.gov/foia](http://www.doi.gov/foia) or at the United States Department of Justice web site, [www.usdoj.gov](http://www.usdoj.gov).

(Note: Concerning requests for law enforcement records only, please know that Congress has excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. 552© (2006 & Supp. IV (2010)). This response is limited to those documents that are subject to the requirements of the FOIA.)



In your request, you indicated a desire for "expedited service". Absent an NPS grant for expedited service, you will receive a formal response to your request no later than 30 days from the date of this letter.
